The Works of the Duneland Weaver's Guild April 5 through April 30

The Duneland Weaver's Guild will be showcasing their work during the month of April in the front gallery space. Although they are not able to host their annual Style Show in person this year, with the help of Chris Pupillo at Bright Ideas Creative Services there is a virtual style show that can be viewed soon on their website at https://dunelandweaversguild.org/ or the Chesterton Art Center website at www.chestertonart.org.

These very talented fiber artists have been busy creating a lot of wonderfully woven items during the pandemic last year and are very anxious for you to see them. "Doing our style show virtually may even bring us new opportunities!" Margaret Jones said as she arranged shawls on Niki and Lori Pavlopoulos, models posing for the video recently at the Chesterton Art Center. The Guild fills its exhibit space each April with masterful and exquisite handmade garments and homewares like wall hangings and

and delivery of items seen online by calling the Center at (219) 926-4711.


Innovating in this unusual year, the Chesterton Art Center is making the style show video part of the exhibit. Gallery and online visitors will get the full experience of handwoven or knitted garments presented on models, as well as see closeups of pattern and structure. Margaret Jones' commentary on design peppered with fiber insider know-how is informative and assists with purchase decisions. Most garments modeled are for sale.

Weaving is a lively art in Northwest Indiana. The Duneland Weavers Guild has met monthly for more than seventy years, September through May. A program follows a members' show and tell each month. Current fiber artists, or those wishing to learn weaving are invited to join the Guild. Zoom meetings were held this past year, but the Guild hopes to return to its current home at Three Moons Fiber Works in Chesterton soon. Visit dunelandweaverguild.org for details on membership.

Sherron Pampalone, Guild President, and Wendy Marciniak, Art Center President and CEO, see the virtual style show as sharing the craft and art of fiber arts with a wider audience. "Weaving is not a lost art," noted Wendy. We use everyday objects that are commercially woven such as bath towels without realizing that local people have looms and spinning equipment in their homes and are making clothing and towels. Lisa Pavlopoulos, Guild member, hopes visitors not only grasp the beauty of the objects but learn about the fibers and time involved with their construction.

Come and See Our Children's Art Education Program Exhibit!



April 5th through April 30

Our Chesterton Art Center children's program focused on modern art movements. Starting in September with Impressionism and moving through the western art history timeline each month through to Pop Art. What is new and very special about this year is that every single class took place through a Zoom virtual platform.

Students from preschool through high school logged on each day from home for a live instruction in an interactive class with Ms. Jen. Parents from all over the area and even out of state, picked up their red bag of art supplies at the beginning of each month. Some of our students attended for a couple months and many stayed through most of the year.

Our classes are designed with that choice and flexibility in mind. Each week children met and were able to discuss artwork, trends, news and personal accomplishments in an open conversational online space. Young artists were challenged to embrace the elements of art and focus on specific skills each month pertaining to the supplies received. Through the virtual platform we were able to "zoom" in on paint strokes of the masters, look at photos of the places great artists come from, walk through virtual online galleries, and learn about figure drawing by drawing directly on the screen. We could not be more proud of these kids and the growth they have experienced through their work. As the artwork came in this month we were amazed by the children's creations, full of imagination, beauty and perspective.

The Chesterton Art Center is so very grateful to have Jennifer Aitchison as our amazing Children's Art Education Instructor...who brought a terrific hands-on art program to her students in the midst of a pandemic. Jen quickly became a Zoom teacher expert, packing up new art supplies in bright red bags for pickup every month. Knowing how much children needed a creative outlet during the stressful year of being at home away from extended family and friends, teachers, and classmates Jen went above and beyond to ensure her students had a great art experience "Through the Screen." May Real-Time Virtual Classes with Mrs. Jen!

On-site classes may be added later when it is safe to do so. A bag stuffed with generous supplies is included in the tuition and will be picked up from the Art Center once at the beginning of each month. Any supplies left at the end of the month are yours to keep! Classes are designed for preschool, elementary, home school, middle school, and high school ages. Students of all ages will actively participate in learning, while studying one of the major movements of modern art history each month.

Tuition is \$90 per month for high school, middle school, elementary, and home school students (the member rate is \$70), and \$75 for preschool & kindergarten students (the member rate is \$55). Preschoolers will need assistance from someone at home. Families must be current members of the Chesterton Art Center to receive the member rate. For the month of May our children's classes will focus on pieces celebrating Spring, up-close nature and the American Female Artist. We will discuss how American artists like Augusta Savage, Georgia O'Keeffe and Mary Cassatt influenced major art movements in history. There will be a generous mix of supplies in the bag. Beginning/Intermediate Virtual Watercolor Workshop for Adults with Dale Popovich, IWS

Dale L. Popovich, IWS will be offering a two-day Beginning/Intermediate Virtual Watercolor Workshop on Saturday, April 24th and Saturday, May 8th from 10:00 am – 1:00 pm. A perfect class for the first time painter or a wonderful refresher for those slightly more experienced. In this zoom workshop, students will walk away with a better understanding of transparent watercolor. In this

workshop Dale will guide students as they concentrate on reflections of water. A better understanding of how to cross mixed colors that best capture the reflections in the water will be demonstrated. In this process, he will illustrate how to block-in and build a painting properly. Students will experience various applications of watercolor, color palette, properties of watercolor, tools, and techniques. Dale's objective through the step-by-step instruction will show how to avoid watercolor problems and grow as a painter

Workshop Session #1, April 24th, Dale will conduct a 2.5-hour painting workshop on Zoom stopping between steps and answering questions along the way. During the painting process, photos will be taken of each step. The photos will be added to the original packet creating the Popovich's Start-to-Finish packet.

Workshop Session #2, May 8th, Dale will lead a Zoom Group Critique sharing his screen with students. During this time, he will walk artists through two paintings and answer any additional questions. Students will receive a recording of the entire workshop to refer to as often as they wish.

Tuition is \$115 for members and \$135 for non-members. Supplies are not included in this workshop. After payment is received, a supply list will be provided. In addition, a full reference packet will be sent prior to the workshop which will also include the Zoom links. Students must register and pay before the first class.
