

Youth Arts Outreach – Expansion in Action!





This past month wrapped up the third session of CAC's 25-week Youth Arts Outreach program in partnership with the Duneland Boys & Girls Club and the Duneland Family YMCA. This session was especially exciting as it launched our expansion where we now simultaneously serve all five YMCA elementary after school sites in addition to the Boys & Girls Club, allowing us to serve up to 170 kids every week!

During this session, artists explored the topic Art in Action as they pulled inspiration from public art and learned of all the ways art positively impacts our community. With guidance from CAC instructors Emily Blossom and Hailey Perritt, students created their very own mural designs, drew portraits of their future selves, and designed impactful posters with positive messages.

The Youth Arts Outreach program supports CAC's mission of creating accessible, enriching arts programming for our community and is generously funded by Cleveland-Cliffs Foundation.

TAG! Teen Arts Group

This past month, Teen Arts Group (TAG) members celebrated the opening of their third annual exhibition at Red Cup Cafe. This year's exhibition is titled WONDER and showcases the work of 14 teen artists, grades 8-12.

WONDER highlights the curiously creative minds of each artist as they explore a variety of media ranging in graphite, acrylics, fiber, digital illustration, and jewelry. Their work gives insight to the way they interpret the world around them, and their art becomes an outward expression of their thoughts.

We are now serving grades 6-9 in addition to grades 3-5, serving up to 45 kids each lesson!

For the February lessons, CAC instructor Emily Blossom worked with grades 3-5 as they created imaginative zines filled with stories about how they can better their community. CAC instructor Hailey Perritt worked with grades 6-9 as students imagined unique mural designs.

After School Art Express Yourself

The March sessions of After School Art are instructed by Jen Aitchison and will focus on color, texture, and symbols as students work to create expressive art about themselves. With inspiration from artists Jean-Michel Basquiat, Edvard Munch, and Franz Marc, students will create dynamic artwork that showcases their feelings and personality through a mixture of collage, drawing, and painting media.

After School Art classes are offered every month from September-May for ages 5-16. During each 4-class monthly session, students will explore an arts-related topic, movement, or technique through a variety of 2D media such as watercolor, pastel, graphite, acrylic, or printmaking. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

After School Sculpture Bird Sculptures

The March session of After School Sculpture is instructed by Emily Blossom and will focus on bird sculptures! Students will study different species of birds as they learn about the colors, textures, and features that make each bird unique. Students will then create their own bird sculpture using air dry clay, acrylic paints, and additional decorative materials. Textured feathers, delicate beaks, and vibrant colors will all help to bring these little creatures to life!

After School Sculpture class is offered every month from September-May for ages 8-12. During each 4-class monthly session, students will explore an arts-related topic, movement, or technique through a variety of 3D media such as clay, plaster, paper mache, or mixed materials. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Preschool Pop-In Abstract Paintings

The March session of Preschool Pop-in is instructed by Jen Aitchison and will focus on sensory painting techniques with color mixing and texture as students create abstract artwork showcasing their feelings.

Preschool Pop-Ins are offered on the 2nd Tuesday of each month from 9-10:30 AM and are recommended for ages 3-5. Young artists will focus on the development of fine motor skills through creative arts learning experiences. Each class will focus on a unique theme that highlights color, shape, cutting, building or painting. Parents and/or caregivers are encouraged to stay and create together with their young artist. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Specialty Classes Relief Printmaking for Teens

With guidance from Katie Wiley, this class will take students through the linocut printing process as they create a unique carved design and set of prints. Linocut printmaking is the process of carving a design into a rubber-like material, inking the surface, and then transferring the image to a piece of paper to create a series of 'relief prints'. Students will learn safe carving techniques, proper inking with a brayer, how to pull a clean print, and how to title their piece. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Understanding Acrylics Workshop

1-day workshop / Saturday, March 2 from 10 AM-1 PM

With guidance from Diana Stezalski, students will be introduced to the versatile medium of acrylic paint. Through a series of painting exercises, students will develop a greater understanding of paint application, tools and brush types, and suitable supports for acrylics — growing their confidence altogether. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Intro to Digital Photography

4-class session / Monday, March 4-25 from 6-8 PM

With instruction from Deb Armstrong, students will learn how to operate their digital cameras and compose eyecatching photos rather than just snapshots. The class will include the basics on camera functions and settings, lighting and exposure, composition, file management and storage, digital editing and online use. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Multi-Range Drawing

4-class session / Wednesday, March 6-27 from 10:30 AM-12:30 PM

With guidance from Diana Stezalski, this multi-range class will allow students to explore the vast possibilities of drawing methods and media. Students will learn to draw from observation, practice shading techniques, and work with a variety of media including ink pens, charcoal, and graphite. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Abstract Oil Painting + Cold Wax Workshop SOLD OUT

With guidance from Patty Roberts, students will learn about the infinite possibilities of abstract artmaking as they create a pair of paintings using the combination of cold wax and oil paint. With creativity guiding the way, students will learn to work more freely as they play with color combinations and composition, practice layering and mark making techniques, and use a series of tools to experiment with surface texture. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

With guidance from Cheryl Cavlovic, students will learn about the history and practice of basket weaving, from its early beginnings to its evolution in cultures across the globe. Basic weaving techniques will be taught as students construct a hand-woven bike basket made from reed and wicker. Students will follow the proper weaving process and then personalize their project with color, pattern, and stain choices. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Exploring Watermedia II Workshop - March 23

Exploring Watermedia II Workshop

1-day workshop / Saturday, March 23 from 12-3 PM

This workshop is a great next step for students who are ready to push their watermedia skills further along! With guidance from certified art teacher Laura Krentz, students will move beyond the basics of paint application and materials as they transition to the technical side of watercolors and gouache. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

There will be a focus on spring-themed projects, but all are welcome to create their own unique design. Jun 3-7 / FUNdamentals of Clay

Ages 9-12 from 8:30-11 AM / Instructed by Liz Cowan / downstairs classroom \$150 for non-members / \$135 for current CAC Family Members

Calling all clay creatives! Students will learn the fundamentals of working with clay as they explore hand building techniques of coil, pinch, and slab. In addition, they can enjoy a wheel throwing experience to learn basic throwing processes. Projects will be imaginative and fun as students learn to play with surface decoration, scale, and style in their unique sculptures.

June 10-14 / All About Architecture

Ages 9-12 from 8:30-11 AM / Instructed by Mindy Milan / upstairs classroom \$150 for non-members / \$135 for current CAC Family Members

LEGO lovers will put their building skills to the test as students explore all-things architecture and understand how a community is constructed. Working together, students will use a combination of architectural LEGO bricks, drawings, foam core, and other 3D materials to construct model cities that consider vertical living, transportation, greenspace preservation, and other basic design challenges of growing communities. construction.

Jun 10-14 / Printmakers at Play

Let's get printing! Students will explore the endless possibilities of printmaking as they learn both traditional and experimental methods of printing. Each day will feature a new printing process including monoprinting, relief printing, letterpress, and LEGO printing. Students will use their imagination to develop unique designs for each print project, ending with a handmade accordion book that showcases all of their hard work.

Jun 3-7 / Ceramics + Sculpture

Study the properties of clay and learn how to become a successful ceramicist.
