## Youth Arts Outreach Program Returns + Grows

CAC is happy to announce the expansion of our outreach programs! This year, we will be returning to Duneland Boys & Girls Club and will also now serve the Duneland Family YMCA for a 25-week Youth Arts Outreach Program. At both sites, CAC instructors will be leading hands-on, exciting art lessons that highlight unique topics during each 5-week 'camp' session. The program begins September 15 and will run through May.

## Youth Art Classes

#### Afterschool Art Classes

Afterschool Art Classes are offered every month from September-May for ages 5-16. During each 4-class monthly session, students will explore an arts-related theme, topic, or movement through a wide variety of 2D media such as watercolor, pastel, graphite, acrylic, or printmaking.

Because each monthly session offers a different theme and set of projects, families are welcomed to register for one session, a few, or the whole year!

Tuition for each 4-week session is \$90 for non-members and \$70 for current CAC Family Members. All supplies provided.

#### **AFTERSCHOOL ART: SEPTEMBER**

The September sessions of After School Art will focus on the Realist Art Movement, With instruction from Jen Aitchison, students will discuss Realist artists Courbet and Millet, leaders of the first modern art movement. Both artists were known for portraying everyday people, landscapes, and animals in a natural way. There will be a strong focus on animals as students work in both drawing and painting. In October, students will be focusing on the Bauhaus Art Movement.

## **Teen Ceramics**

This 4-week class will meet from Saturday, September 17- October 15 (no Oct 8) at 10 AM-12 PM and is for ages 12 to 18.

With guidance from Emily Casella, students will learn basic wheel throwing skills. They will work to complete a teacup and saucer with intricate handles. Students can look forward to experimenting with different decoration techniques that set them apart from the crowd! Class is limited to 5 students.

Tuition for non-members is \$120 and \$100 for current CAC Family members. All materials are provided.

#### **New!** Preschool Pop-In Classes

Preschool Pop-Ins are offered on the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 10-11:30 AM and are recommended for ages 3-5. Young artists will focus on the development of fine motor skills through creative arts learning experiences. Each class will focus on a unique theme that highlights color, shape, cutting, building, or painting. Parents and/or caregivers are encouraged to stay & create together with their young artist. If dropping off, students must be potty-trained.

Because each monthly session offers a different theme and special project, families are welcomed to register for one session, a few, or the whole year!

Tuition for each class for one child and one grown-up is \$30 for non-members and \$20 for current CAC Family Members. All supplies



#### PRESCHOOL POP-IN | SEPTEMBER

The September Preschool Pop-In session meets on Tuesday, September 13 at 10-11:30 AM and is recommended for ages 3-5. This month's Pop-In will focus on owls. Let's make paintings of a wonderful feathered friend! With instruction from Jen Aitchison, students will create an owl painting while practicing holding a brush and filling in shapes.



## **Adult Art Classes**

Our classes provide a creative space for artists to learn at every age and level.



#### Pastel Birds & Animals Workshop: Feathers & Fur with Mary Ann Pals

This two-day pastel workshop will meet on September 10-11 from 9:30 AM-3:00 PM, with a 1-hour lunch break each day. This workshop is recommended for advanced beginners + above.

With instruction from IAPS Master Circle Pastelist, Mary Ann Pals, students will learn not only how to use the soft pastel medium to blend and layer, but also how to create believable feathers & fur as they learn to render portraits of birds and animals. While using reference photos, students will learn how to avoid the pitfalls of following a photo too closely. Sound composition will be emphasized. Mary Ann will give a demo and will also provide individual help to students.

Students will have access to free samples of Richeson hand-rolled soft pastels from a special 40-piece set called Fur and Feathers and one sheet of PastelMat paper.

Tuition is \$135 for non-members and \$115 for current CAC members.

## Intro to Digital Photography with Deb Armstrong

This 4-week class will meet from Monday, September 12-October 3 at 6-8 PM.

With instruction from Deb Armstrong, participants will learn how to operate their digital cameras and compose eye-catching photos rather than just snapshots. The class will include the basics on camera functions and settings, lighting and exposure, composition, file management and storage, digital editing and online use. There will be assignments and group critiques along the way to advance photography skills. This course is geared toward beginners and will offer questionand-answer time before and after each class.

Tuition is \$95.00 for nonmembers and \$85.00 for current CAC members. Students must bring their own digital cameras. This class is focuses on DSLR cameras, all brands welcomed.

#### Oil Painting with Jane Cowley

This 6-week class will meet from Monday, September 12-October 17 at 7-9 PM.

Students will be introduced to the methods and materials of oil painting with award-winning artist Jane Cowley. While oil painting is often viewed as a tricky medium, the instructor will make students feel at ease as they learn at a comfortable pace that works for their skill level. Lessons will include composition, color mixing, values, various techniques, spatial relations, and perspective. This class is open to all levels, including beginners. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Tuition is \$150 for non-members and \$130 for current CAC members.

### Fundamental Drawing with Laura Krentz

This 4-week class will meet from Wednesday, September 14-October 5 at 6-8 PM.

This introductory drawing class is instructed by Laura Krentz and is recommended for beginners. If you've always wanted to learn to draw or improve your basic drawing skills, this class is for you! Learn in a stress-free, fun environment with a certified art teacher. Students will have access to a variety of drawing media as each class will highlight different drawing tools such as simple pencils, pastels, and ink pens to expand your exploration. You'll learn contour line drawing, shading, color application, and freeform exploration using pens to create whimsical works. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Tuition is \$120 for non-members and \$100 for current CAC members.

Beginning Ceramics with Maureen Duffy-Daugavietis

#### Cell Phone Photography Workshop with Deb Armstrong

Join us for this one-day workshop on Saturday, September 17 from 1-4 PM.

Participants will learn expanded cell phone camera settings as well as basic composition and lighting techniques that will boost your creativity. Since we're all using our cell phones as a primary camerafor social media, for family, etc.—learn all of the tricks and techniques to use it even better!

Tuition is \$55.00 for nonmembers and \$45.00 for current CAC members.

#### Beginning Ceramics with Maureen Duffy-Daugavietis

This 6-week class will meet from Wednesday, September 21-October 26 at 6-9 PM.

With guidance from Maureen Duffy-Daugavietis, students will learn basic techniques for wheel throwing, hand building, and how to finish their works using standard decorating and glazing styles. With 5 wheels and plenty of workspace for hand building, students will rotate between both methods to create finished ceramic works. This class is recommended for beginners & advanced beginners.

This class is a prerequisite for the Intermediate Ceramics class.

Tuition is \$185 for non-members and \$165 for current CAC members. All materials are provided, including 12 lbs. of clay.

## Art, Writing & Nature Workshop with Suzy Vance

This 1-day workshop is held on September 24 from 12-4 PM.

With guidance from Suzy Vance, students will pull inspiration from nature as they create a unique, personal booklet full of art and writings.

For the 1st part of the workshop, students will meet off-site at the Beverly Shores train station (intersection of US Highway 12 & Broadway St). Students will then be directed to a trail nearby where they will go on a walk and explore the lush nature all around them (sketchbooks/notebooks and digital/cell phone cameras recommended). They'll return to a quiet place to reflect, make notes, begin sketches, and even share with others if they choose.

For the 2nd part of the workshop, students will meet back at CAC to create a small booklet that commemorates their nature walk through writings, photos, and drawings.

Tuition is \$50.00 for nonmembers and \$40.00 for current CAC members. All supplies included.

#### Bookbinding Workshop with Terrence Chouinard

This 1-day workshop will meet on Thursday, September 29 at 6-9 PM and is recommended for teens and adults, ages 16+.

A folded piece of paper makes a "folio." One folio inside another makes a "signature." One or multiple signatures sewn together make a "book".

With instruction from Terrence Chouinard, this workshop will cover basic bookbinding terms and tools with ample time allowed for hands-on practice. Students will construct a single signature/pamphlet binding with cover variations. This workshop will lay the conceptual and practical foundation for more advanced bookbinding skills.

Tuition is \$70.00 for nonmembers and \$60.00 for current CAC members. (A \$10 supply fee is due to the instructor at the beginning of class.)
