

Dual Exhibitions in September

Exhibition: September 2–30, 2023 Artists' Reception: September 9, 12–2 PM

Chesterton Art Center is pleased to announce two new upcoming exhibitions September 2–30, 2023, titled *Collaborating with the Natural World* by local artist Suzy Vance, and *As I See It*, a group exhibition by CAC's Teen Arts Group members. An Artists' Reception with both Vance and TAG members is planned for Saturday, September 9, 12–2 PM CST. Vance's work is a combination of photography and haiku and will be shown in the upper gallery, while TAG members will be exhibiting a collection of work from the past year in the lower gallery.

Vance describes herself as a "born again" lawyer who is inspired by the world and people around her. She expresses her creativity in a variety of media, one of which is Haiga, a combination of photography and Haiku. Seeking to foster self awareness and peace in the world, she hopes her work will draw the viewer in and imbue gratitude in each of us for all that we are and all that contributes to us each day in every moment.

As I See It is a group exhibition of CAC's Teen Arts Group (TAG) made up of teen artists ages 14-18 from CHS, CMS, and VHS. Their work collectively explores the perspective of leaving adolescence and entering early adulthood and how this transitionary period changes their view of the world. The imaginative ideas become tangible stories that are shared through their expressive work as they attempt to define the world as they see it. TAG artists in the show include Hana Byrt, Summer Machnik, Marley Mayer, Natalie Orban, CeCe Post, Kendra Ritchie, Brooklyn Towner, and Lauren Yarosz.





Annual CAC Members **Exhibit Guidelines**

It's time to start thinking about our Annual CAC Members' Exhibit! December 2, 2023 - January 4, 2024 Artists' Reception is Saturday December 9 from 12 - 2 PM



- All current CAC members are invited to submit original work for this annual exhibit. Please contact the Center if you are unsure of your membership status.
- Member artists may submit two pieces smaller than 16 in x 20 in OR one larger piece not to exceed 24 x 30 inches. Please contact us with any questions.
- All artworks must be framed and/or ready to hang to be accepted. Sculptural works will be placed on pedestals in the gallery.
- All artworks must be clean (no dust or scratches on frames or mats) to be accepted.
- Members may only submit works that have not been shown at the Center in the past year, including in the member gallery or gift shop and last year's member exhibition.
- Artworks in the Members' Exhibit may be available for sale, and CAC will take a 30% commission on any sold artworks.

Youth Programs/September



After School Art Me, Myself, and I

The September sessions of After School Art are instructed by Jen Aitchison and will focus on portraiture and drawing people. Students will gain introductory figure drawing skills as they learn to break down facial features into basic shapes and lines. They will study famous self-portraits from historic artists like Frida Kahlo, Rembrandt, and Vincent Van Gogh as they explore symbolism and create art all about themselves!

After School Art classes are offered every month from September-May for ages 5-16. During each 4-class monthly session, students will explore an arts-related topic, movement, or technique through a variety of 2D media such as watercolor, pastel, graphite, acrylic, or printmaking. Because each monthly session offers a different theme and set of projects, families are welcome to register for one session, a few, or the whole year!

After School Sculpture Creating with Coils

The September session of After School Sculpture is instructed by Terese Maletta and will focus on the clay hand building technique of coils. Students will learn about the versatility of working with coils as they study both functional and artistic methods of using coils in their clay projects and work to construct coil vessels.

After School Sculpture class is offered every month from September-May for ages 8-12. During each 4-class monthly session, students will explore an arts-related topic, movement, or technique through a variety of 3D media such as clay, plaster, paper mache, or mixed materials.

Preschool Pop-In Playful Portraits

The September session of Preschool Pop-In is instructed by Jen Aitchison and will focus on people! Students will learn about basic colors and shapes as they create an imaginative self-portrait full of joy.

Preschool Pop-Ins are offered on the 2nd Tuesday of each month from 9-10:30 AM and are recommended for ages 3-5. Young artists will focus on the development of fine motor skills through creative arts learning experiences. Each class will focus on a unique theme that highlights color, shape, cutting, building or painting. Parents and/or caregivers are encouraged to stay and create together with their young artist.

Teen Figure Drawing Workshop

1-day workshop / Saturday, September 30 from 10 AM-12 PM

With guidance from Diana Stezalski, teens will have a special opportunity to grow their observational figure drawing skills as they learn to draw from a clothed figure model. This introductory workshop will cover essential elements of figure drawing including gesture, contour, proportion, and composition as students develop a series of quick studies.

Abstract Oil Painting + Cold Wax Workshop - September 16

Critique Club

1-day workshop / Saturday, September 9 from 10 AM-12 PM

Facilitated by award-winning painter Mark Vander Vinne, Critique Club invites artists of all skill levels, media, and styles to gain direct feedback on their work in an encouraging and friendly environment. Artists can bring up to two pieces of their original work for analysis and critique from peers. Work can be in any stage — from general concept to final version. Let's learn, grow, and talk about art together! This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Tuition is \$10/person, bring 1-2 pieces for critique

Hand Builder Boot Camp

3-class session / Monday, September 11-25 from 6-9 PM

With guidance from Maureen Duffy-Daugavietis, students will learn the three hand building techniques of pinch pots, slabs, and coils. Each student will produce 2-3 pieces of small functional pottery and learn how to finish their work using standard glazing methods.

This class is recommended for beginners & advanced beginners. Higher-level students can work on independent projects per instructor approval. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Abstract Oil Painting + Cold Wax Workshop

1-day workshop / Saturday, September 16 from 10 AM-1 PM

With guidance from Patty Roberts, students will learn about the infinite possibilities of abstract art making as they create a pair of paintings using the combination of cold wax and oil paint. With creativity guiding the way, students will learn to work more freely as they play with color combinations and composition, practice layering and mark-making techniques, and use a series of tools to experiment with surface texture. This intuitive style of painting will allow students to put perfectionist ideals aside and let whatever happens on the paper be part of the fun! All skill levels are welcome, including beginners. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Tuition is \$85 for non-members / \$76.50 for current CAC members, supplies included

Intro to Digital Photography

4-class session / Monday, September 18-October 9 from 6-8 PM

With instruction from Deb Armstrong, students will learn how to operate their digital cameras and compose eyecatching photos rather than just snapshots. The class will include the basics on camera functions and settings, lighting and exposure, composition, file management and storage, digital editing and online use. There will be assignments and group critiques along the way to advance photography skills, as well as question-and-answer time before and after each class. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Tuition is \$95 for non-members / \$85.50 for current CAC members, students provide their own DSLR camera

Letterpress 101 - September 23

Ceramic Dish Workshop 1-day workshop / Friday, September 22 from 6-9 PM

Grab your bestie, partner, sibling, or come meet new people during this fun evening of creating! With guidance from Maureen Duffy-Daugavietis, students will construct a medium-sized dish or tray, commonly nicknamed a poof plate", using the slab process and various decorative techniques. Students will be encouraged to add textures and additional details to make their project uniquely their own. Students will complete glazing, and the Center will complete firing. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Letterpress 101 Workshop

1-day workshop / Saturday, September 23 from 10 AM-1 PM

With guidance from Ida Short, this workshop will introduce students to the letterpress process, one of the oldest forms of moveable Type. Students will learn about the impressive history of letterpress printing and work from a small press as they print their own pangram, short poem, or personal mantra on a poster. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Charm of Colored Pencils

4-class session / Wednesday, September 27-October 18 from 5:30-7:30 PM

With guidance from Emily Casella, this introductory class will uncover the vast properties of contemporary colored pencils. Students will investigate different blending and stroke techniques, learn proper shading and layering methods, understand how to replicate accurate color, and find joy in coloring from the world around them and from their vibrant minds. All skill levels welcomed, including beginners. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.
