
First Place was awarded to Doris Myers for her acrylic painting called "Pond #2". Second Place went to Jason Bowman for his oil painting titled "Sentinels"

Children's and Teens Art Education

Summer Art Camps for Kids are here!

Campers will learn various art techniques while using multiple media. Every session includes painting and drawing. A little time will be spent learning about a modern artist while working in the "theme" of the week. Kids will take home their fine art and craft projects at the end of the week. Classes for children ages 5 - 8 will run from 8:30 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. Ages 8 and up will run from 12:00 p.m. - 2:30 p.m.



Week 3 - June 21 - 24 - PRINTMAKING

We will explore various techniques in fine art printing, including traditional linoleum cuts and modern stencil work. Younger children will work in foam boards instead of linoleum. Making prints is something that artists of all ages enjoy. Drawing and color will also be a focus this week as we create unique, one of a kind prints as well as other 2-D pieces
