Youth Arts Outreach



This past month wrapped up the fourth session of CAC's 25-week Youth Arts Outreach program in partnership with the Duneland Boys & Girls Club and the Duneland Family YMCA. Thanks to the program's recent expansion, up to 170 kids are now being served at their after school sites each week!

During this session, Art + Words, students learned how letters can become visual tools in their artwork and explored the many art forms that use words including posters, comics, and poetry. Special thanks to CAC instructors Emily Blossom and Hailey Perritt for working with our outreach students.

The 5th session runs April 2-May 2 and will explore the topic 'Make Some Noise' as students construct handmade instruments.

After School Art Still Life Paintings

The April sessions of After School Art are instructed by Jen Aitchison and will focus on observational drawing and painting skills as students learn to create a successful still life. Students will move through the history of still life painting around the world, including its beginnings in ancient Egypt, rising popularity during Impressionism, and the modern ways artists utilize still life methods today. Lessons will cover observational studies, shading, and color theory.

After School Art classes are offered every month from September-May for ages 5-16. During each 4-class monthly session, students will explore an arts-related topic, movement, or technique through a variety of 2D media such as watercolor, pastel, graphite, acrylic, or printmaking. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

After School Sculpture Abstract Sculptures

The April session of After School Sculpture is instructed by Terese Maletta and will focus on abstract sculpture! In celebration of Earth Day, students will work to upcycle everyday materials such as cardboard, plastic, wire, and wood as they construct a series of unique abstract sculptures inspired by famous artists like Dale Chihuly, Jean Dubuffet, and Alexander Calder. Students will be challenged to consider 3D construction through shape, form, color, and pattern, and sculptures will be decoratively finished with acrylic painting techniques.

After School Sculpture class is offered every month from September-May for ages 8-12. During each 4-class monthly session, students will explore an arts-related topic, movement, or technique through a variety of 3D media such as clay, plaster, paper mache, or mixed materials. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Ceramics

6-class sessions Monday evenings/ Monday, April 1-May 6 from 6-9 PM SOLD OUT Wednesday mornings / Wednesday, April 3-May 8 from 9 AM-12 PM SOLD OUT

With guidance from Maureen Duffy-Daugavietis, students will learn basic techniques for wheel throwing, hand building, and how to finish their works using standard decorating and glazing styles. Students will rotate between both methods to create finished ceramic works. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Tuition is \$185 for non-members / \$166.50 for current CAC members, supplies included

Beginning Stained Glass SOLD OUT

8-class session / Tuesday, April 2-May 21 from 7-9 PM

With guidance from Judy Gregurich and Mark Montgomery, students will learn the art of copper foil stained glass, originally invented by Louis Tiffany. Master the techniques of working with glass, and learn how to create beautiful works from a variety of colors. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Independent Study Stained Glass SOLD OUT

8-class session / Tuesday, April 2-May 21 from 7-9 PM

With guidance from Judy Gregurich and Mark Montgomery, this class is designed for students who have taken a previous stained glass class at the Center. Students may work on their own projects at their own pace with assistance from the instructors as needed. In addition, the instructors provide an optional "challenge project" that pushes the skills and creativity of students. Mosaic artists can now join fellow glass enthusiasts, too! This class is held in the lower gallery.

Multi-Range Drawing II

4-class session / Wednesday, April 3-24 from 10:30 AM-12:30 PM

With guidance from Diana Stezalski, this class is a continuation of Multi-Range Drawing where students will further explore the vast possibilities of drawing methods and media. With an initial understanding of technique and media now established, students will be challenged to work more independently as they draw from observation, advance their shading skills, and work with a variety of media including ink pens, charcoal, and graphite. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Wheel Throwing Boot Camp SOLD OUT

4-class session / Wednesday, April 3-24 from 6-9 PM

With guidance from Maureen Duffy-Daugavietis, students will throw on the wheel as they learn to center, push, pull, shape, and trim their hand-thrown ceramic pieces. Each student will produce 2-3 pieces of small functional pottery and learn how to finish their work using standard glazing methods. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Students will learn the process of planning a design, carving a linoleum block, properly inking the block, and pulling a successful print. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Intro to Acrylics

4-class session / Thursday, April 4-25 from 10:30 AM-12:30 PM

With guidance from Diana Stezalski, students will explore the versatile medium of acrylic paint. Color mixing, value, composition, perspective, and texture will be addressed through a series of weekly painting exercises as students experiment with mediums, brush types, and supports suitable for acrylics. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Mixed Media Collage Workshop

1-day workshop / Saturday, April 6 from 10 AM-1 PM

With guidance from Laurel Izard, students will experiment with a variety of mixed media techniques as they work to create a unique abstract collage. Media exploration will include acrylic painting, stamping, stenciling, and lifting paint from gelli plates as students produce their collage papers. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Creating Contrast: Pastel Workshop - April 27-28

Ceramic Planter Workshop 1-day workshop / Saturday, April 13 from 1-4 PM

With guidance from Maureen Duffy-Daugavietis, students will construct a hand-built medium-sized planter using the slab process and various decorative techniques to make each student's project uniquely their own. Celebrate Earth Day and the arrival of spring with handmade ceramics — all that's

missing is the perfect plant to go with it! Students will complete glazing, and the Center will complete firing. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Tuition is \$50 for non-members / \$45 for current CAC members, supplies included **Charm of Colored Pencils** 4-class session / Tuesday, April 16-May 7 from 5:30-7:30 PM

With guidance from Emily Casella, this class will cover the vast properties of contemporary colored pencils. Students will learn in-depth color mixing, experiment with different mark making styles and shading techniques, and explore the unique ways colored pencils can express abstract emotions or mimic objects from real life. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

1-day workshop / Saturday, April 20 from 10 AM-1 PM

With guidance from Diana Stezalski, students will grow their observational drawing skills as they learn to draw a successful portrait from a clothed figure model. This introductory workshop will cover essential elements of portrait drawing including gesture, contour, proportion, facial features, and composition as students develop a series of quick studies. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

Creating Contrast: Pastel Workshop

2-day workshop / April 27-28 from 9:30 AM-3 PM, with a 1-hour lunch break each day

With instruction from IAPS Master Circle pastelist Mary Ann Pals, students will learn to render a pastel painting with strong light + dark contrast using the subject of their choice. Sound composition, surface color choices, and attention to edges of shapes will be emphasized as students study reference photos and watch Mary Ann's hands-on demonstrations. Students will have ample work time with individual instructor help as they work to execute their own successful project. This class is held in the downstairs classroom.

Tuition is \$135 for non-members / \$121.50 for current CAC members + supply list Independent Study Studio Art 5-class session / Tuesday, April 30-May 28 from 10:30 AM-12:30 PM

With guidance from Diana Stezalski, this class is designed for experienced students who are ready to move beyond foundational skills and want dedicated studio time. Each class will present a new exercise that challenges students to escape creative blocks and push their creative practice further along. The rest of class time will be dedicated to independent studio time, critique and feedback, and/or collaboration with peers. This class is held in the upstairs classroom.

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CAC is offering an exciting series of youth + teen summer programming for ages 5-18 that highlight various art techniques and media, involve discussions about modern artists, and all follow a unique theme that encourages creativity and collaboration.



Teen Studio Intensives

CAC is featuring a series of special studio intensives just for teens, ages 13+. Each intensive focuses on a specific media and is designed to challenge students to elevate their current art skills or explore an entirely new practice, becoming a stronger artist altogether.

Jun 3-7 / Ceramics + Sculpture

Ages 13+ from 12-2:30 PM / Instructed by Liz Cowan / downstairs classroom \$150 for non-members / \$135 for current CAC Family Members

Study the properties of clay and learn how to become a successful ceramicist. Students will be challenged to push the boundaries of traditional ceramics and create unique, exploratory sculptures that play with form, surface decoration, and function while utilizing the hand building techniques of coil, pinch, and slab. Students will also enjoy a special wheel throwing experience while learning basic throwing processes.

Jun 10-14 / Printmaking

Ages 13+ from 8:30-11 AM / Instructed by Ida Short / downstairs classroom \$150 for non-members / \$135 for current CAC Family Members

Explore the various processes of printmaking and gain confidence in this versatile media. Lessons will cover layered printing with Gelli plates, relief printmaking with hand-carved blocks, letterpress typesetting, and experimenting with a variety of print-able surfaces like paper, fabric, and even objects. Students will use their imagination to develop unique designs for each print project, ending with a handmade accordion book that showcases all of their hard work.

Jun 24-28 / Video Production

Ages 13+ from 8:30-11 AM / Instructed by Kyle Murphey / upstairs classroom \$150 for non-members / \$135 for current CAC Family Members

Students will receive an introduction to the world of video production as they learn about the technical and artistic sides of filmmaking. After learning the basics of visual storytelling, students will work in a group as they each take on a role on the 'production team,' capturing footage together with professional camera equipment. For their final project, each student will work independently to edit the footage captured in class into their own short film.

Jul 8-12 / Sewing + Stitching

Ages 13+ from 12-2:30 PM / Instructed by Mary Ann Martin / downstairs classroom \$150 for non-members / \$135 for current CAC Family Members

Students will learn about the traditional craft of sewing and how these skills can be transferred to modern-day uses like upcycled fashion, embroidery, or basic mending. Students will learn to stitch by hand as well as on a machine, learning to make, mend, or modify clothing and other fiber goods. Projects will explore both functional and decorative application of stitching techniques.

Jul 15-19 / Drawing with Colored Pencils

Ages 13+ from 8:30-11 AM / Instructed by Emily Casella / upstairs classroom \$150 for non-members / \$135 for current CAC Family Members
